

"She would respond gratefully as though she was the one receiving the gifts," Executive Director Cindy Heifner said. "That's just the type of person Mary was. "She had a super big heart and loved helping people," Karl said with a big smile. "Mary could see things in people they couldn't see in themselves. Most often she would work behind-the-scenes to help them and just wouldn't give up."

Of all her remarkable qualities, her loving heart was the guide in everything she did. Whether it was serving the Needs Council, family, employees or lending her artistic talents to both the chapel at Good Samaritan Center and the chapel at the University Cen-ter; Mary's heart longed to make a difference for people and to bless others with the gifts and talents she possessed.

The Needs Council was blessed to have been designated as one beneficiary of her IRA upon her passing. Karl revealed, "As one of her chosen charities, she saw how beneficial this gift could be to the Needs Council and the people of this community."

"Sharing and passing it on is what we've endeavored to do. You may not have the money, but you may have the time or a special talent," Karl said. "It was never about money for her, but the connection and the difference she made in someone's life. For others to follow her legacy of love; that would truly be pleasing to Mary."





# Meet Virginia

*Volunteer Client Advisor with a sweet spirit and heart of pure gold* 

We sat down with Virginia Higdon, a volunteer advisor with the Needs Council for over 12 years. Hope you enjoying meeting Virginia as much as we have enjoyed working alongside her!

#### Why do you volunteer for the Needs Council?

Because it has truly been enriching to me. To work in a Christian environment where people care about others, I am truly blessed. It's so important to be involved. We have to give back, it's the most important thing we do.

#### How did you first get connected with us?

In 2005, my neighbor introduced me; they were looking for a Client Advisor. I had earned an associate's degree in Human Services and I've always been comfortable in a helping situation, especially with adults. It's fulfilling to help people who are hurting. I really think it was a God-directed thing.

#### How would you explain your role as a Client Advisor?

Most importantly it is to listen and have understanding of how people are feeling at the moment. It's so hard for some to come and ask and the majority are so grateful for the help. It may not even be money someone needs, it may be emotional. They just need someone to listen and show they care.

# What is your first memory of working with our clients?

The story that has stayed in my mind and has kept me grounded is of helping a young man. He was a cook in a restaurant, married with two children. A family member died and he took off a couple of days for the funeral without pay, so he was short



on rent. When I told him we could help him he started crying and hugged my neck saying, 'I don't know what I would've done if you hadn't helped me'. This young man and his story really left an impact on me. We never know how people are hurting right here in this community.

#### What might someone be surprised to know about you?

*That I'm over 80. I told everyone I was 60 until my daughter threw a surprise party for my 80th! Now the cat's out of the bag.* 

#### What do you do when you aren't volunteering with us?

I love to play MahJongg and Bridge and have always enjoyed cooking. I also am involved with Stephen Ministry and P.E.O., a philanthropic education organization. I have three daughters, four grandchildren and six great grandchildren that I love to spend time with every chance I get.

# What would you tell someone who is thinking of volunteering?

The Needs Council is so very needed. When I moved here I thought I had moved into the perfect community but there are some stories I've heard that will just bring you to your knees. Give back all the wonderful things you have been given. If the community wasn't so generous, the Needs Council couldn't be of any service. If you have the time, you should give it.

Working alongside volunteers like Virginia is one of the intangible gifts I receive daily at the Needs Council. As you read her interview (above the fold) you will get a glimpse of the genuine care Virginia gives to everyone she meets. Such is the beauty of service – it brings out the best in all of us. Anyone who gives of themselves soon realizes the joy they find in volunteering far out-

weighs the sacrifice of time. One of my favorite role models, Mother Teresa taught that service is the essential component of love. Our staff and volunteers experience that love; sometimes in very subtle ways but often in bone crushing hugs from the clients they help!

The poverty of loneliness and feeling uncared for is only cured by caring people. New volunteers sometimes express feelings of inadequacy in the face of client's overwhelming hardships; to that I answer with Mother Teresa's words, *"No act of kindness – no matter how small, is ever wasted".* 

If the opportunity arises, I invite you to listen a little more than usual – it will lift your spirits as well as those around you...and it just may give someone a reason to feel better about themselves!
