

Our Angel Tree and Christmas Families programs are offered to ease the burdens of our neighbors who have struggled immensely this year.

“John” was injured at work and unable to obtain workers’ compensation. With three children, including a special needs student, the mother “Jennifer” works full-time and obtained a second job to help them stay afloat. John learned that surgery is not an option; therefore, he must receive job retraining since his current occupation is no longer possible. This was not the life he envisioned for his family so he began seeing one of our counselors to deal with this new reality. With credit card debt mounting, they asked the Needs Council for help with utilities. The Christmas Families program was also offered, and John initially said no. “We’ve always done that kind of thing for other folks – I just can’t imagine being on the receiving end.”

After we explained the program was completely confidential and promised that in the future they could return to

adopt a family in need, he smiled and said, “You’ve Got a Deal! My kids have felt the drastic cut-backs on everything they enjoy; it’ll be great to see them have a nice Christmas.”

# Hungry to Support Kids

*HEB Gives \$7,000 in Support of Food 4 Kids; Volunteers Shop, Bag & Distribute Weekly to 200+ Children*

As with most everything these days, food costs have increased, so our friends at HEB responded with a generous \$7,000 gift that will help provide supplemental nutrition to over 200 children identified as food insecure by teachers, nurses, and counselors during the school year.

The Needs Council Food 4 Kids program addresses weekend hunger in children who are identified as “under-nourished”. Sadly, Feeding America reports that 1 in 6 children do not have sufficient food in Gillespie County.

Food 4 Kids provides non-refrigerated individual serving-sized nutritional snacks each Friday that children can open and eat. No can opener, microwave, or stove is needed. Some of these children are home on the weekend while their parents work so having “mini” meals that cover the basic food groups and are easy to eat is vital.

Marilyn McNabb, Top Store Leader at H-E-B Fredericksburg, has been a great partner and advocate for the Needs Council. “It’s hard to imagine anyone going hungry in a country with an abundant food supply, especially a child,” she said. “One of HEB’s Pillars of Giving is to provide hunger relief. The backpack program is a great opportunity to ensure support for our community’s most vulnerable, our children.”

Food is only part of the Food 4 Kids equation. Equally vital is having a dedicated group of volunteers who shop, organize, bag, and distribute these items to area schools each and every week.
