
Director's Corner

YES! Believe it or not, it's already time to donate school supplies for the 2023-24 school year. As our students are enjoying their summer break, we are accepting applications from qualifying families. Last year over 700 children went to school with new backpacks filled with the necessary supplies for their grade level. Each year that number grows and with costs rising on seemingly everything, we expect an even larger increase in need.

For families with tight budgets, the looming expense of \$75-100 per child for school supplies can cause great anxiety. The extra costs of school supplies, new clothes, and shoes cuts into money for groceries, utilities, rent, and other necessities. Without assistance, many children would start the school year ill-equipped and embarrassed next to their classmates with all new supplies. Our goal is to provide each child with a new backpack and supplies they can be proud of, and to provide their parents with the peace of mind that starting the school year won't strain their budget to the breaking point.


It takes the help of about 100 volunteers over four to five weeks to collect, collate, and pack the supplies by grade level and campus. We serve all of Gillespie County public schools. We'd love to add you to our volunteer list!

Highlighting Our Volunteers: Sharon Johnson



If you've spent any time at our office, it's likely you've met Sharon Johnson. Sharon is a Needs Council treasure who blesses many others with her talents and positive attitude. We often wonder how we got along before she became a volunteer. Outside her work with us, she's a busy grandmother who follows her grandkids activities and sports. She enjoys being part of the cook team at Holy Ghost Lutheran Church, making meals for local seniors for the Feeding John program. She also volunteers to help keep the Der Stadt Friedhof Cemetery neat and tidy.

We sat down with her to see what drew her to volunteering and what she believes it can do for anyone who chooses to serve.

After her husband passed away in 2009, Sharon began searching for ways to fill her time and her heart. When she received a Need's Council newsletter she thought, "I might need to get involved with them. The first thing I helped with was the school supplies program, but it snowballed from there." Fourteen years later, she is one of our most active volunteers.

Sharon is an accomplished seamstress, rising each morning at 4:30 and sewing until at least 7am. Some of her sewing

projects include quilts for the Lutheran Worldwide Relief program, stuffed animals and toys for local craft fairs, clothes and gifts for family, and over 300 Christmas stockings for the Needs Council's Christmas Families program. Her last sewing machine had 20 million stitches on it!

Sharon is motivated to continue volunteering when she sees the impact on the people she helps – she just loves it! Whether it's School Supplies, Food 4 Kids, Coats for Kids, Christmas Families, or any of our other programs, she loves seeing people's faces light up when they come through the door.

Sharon closes with these words about volunteering at the Needs Council, "You always leave with more than you came with. You will experience the good feeling you get from helping the community and seeing the impact on the people. There's always a need; for myself no task is too big or too small and everyone we help matters."

When clients come in "underwater" with debt, we gently suggest a budgeting appointment with one of our volunteer financial planners. It truly is a gift to the families who decide to take advantage of this program. One couple had such overwhelming debt, their bank advised that bankruptcy might be their only option. When they explained their desire to clear the debt without filing for bankruptcy, we set them up with Cloyd Phillips, a long time Needs Council volunteer. Cloyd looked over all their loans, credit cards, etc., and told them that it was possible, but it would take a long and disciplined approach to become debt free. They said yes; they wanted to learn from Cloyd and dig themselves out of their financial mess. They met weekly, then monthly, and now Cloyd says he's just a cheerleader as they continue with the steps he provided to slowly but surely erase the debt! At first their children were in shock and complained about all the changes, but now they are following their parents' example and saving towards their own college educations.
